UNITED STATES EXPRESS
RATES TO BE INCREASED

Washington, Aug. 13.—Authority to increase express rates 12 1/2 per cent was granted the American Railway Express Company today by the Interstate Commerce Commission. The increase by unofficial estimates will add \$35,000,000 to the annual income of the company. The commission's decision, however, does not take into consideration the recent award of the United States Railway Labor Board of increased wages approximately \$43,000,000 to express company employees and it is expected application soon will be made by the company for an additional advance in rates to meet the new wage scales.
Rates on milk and cream under the commission's decision are further increased to correspond with the advance of 20 per cent for the transportation of such commodities authorized the railroad except where there are no competing railroads between the affected points. In the latter case, an advance of 12 1/2 per cent, is authorized.

MAKES TEST CASE OF LIQUOR CHARGE

The case against Louis Hurwitt, charged with having liquor on his premises other than in his private dwelling, was continued in the police court yesterday afternoon. All the evidence had been taken at previous hearings. W. M. Ryan, appearing for the prosecution, contended that the dwelling occupied by the defendant came within the meaning of the act as a boarding house and not a private dwelling as he kept four boarders. E. S. Ritchie, appearing for the defence, said that one of the so-called boarders was kept by the defendant through charitable motives and could not rightly be called a boarder within the meaning of the act. This was a case which had not come up before the court since the act was passed. The accused put up a deposit of \$50 and he would allow the matter to go up before Chief Justice McKinnon as a test case for him to decide. If the chief justice should decide that the accused was guilty under the act then he would get his \$50 back.

The case was allowed to stand until Sept. 13. E. S. Ritchie appeared for the defence and W. M. Ryan for the prosecution.

GOOD RUN FROM LIVERPOOL
