DIVIDED OVER LIFTING BAN ON ARBUCKLE

One Film Man Says it is "Thumbs Down" for Comedian

Churches Join in the Fight Against His Pictures—Some Exhibitors and Officials Advise Waiting to Hear Reasons for Reinstatement.

New York, Dec. 26.—Prominent New York motion picture exhibitors express doubt if "Fatty" Arbuckle films will be shown here or elsewhere, despite his reinstatement to screen respectability. Their doubts arose from the emphatic nature of the protests which have come from all quarters as a result of Will H. Hays' announcement at Hollywood that the official ban placed on Arbuckle's films at the time of Virginia Rappe's death had been lifted.

Although Hugo Reisensfeld, director of the Rivoli and Rialto theatres, and others said they thought his pictures should be shown to test public opinion, Charles L. O'Reilly, president of the New York State Motion Picture Theatre Owners' Association, spoke for a larger group when he said he thought it likely the public would turn thumbs down on the comedian in advance of a showing of his pictures.
