

## Court Decision on "DUSTBANE" Patents

IN THE KING'S BENCH

The Honourable Mr. Justice Adamson

Wednesday the 10th day of October A. D. 1923.

BETWEEN: DUSTBANE MANUFACTURING COMPANY, LIMITED Plaintiff.

—and—

ORLOFF NEWMAN and SADIE NEWMAN Defendants.

This action having on the 10th day of October, A. D. 1923 come on before the Court on motion for judgment on behalf of the Plaintiff, and upon hearing Counsel for the Plaintiff and for the Defendants.

THE COURT DOOTH ORDER AND ADJUDGE:

That the Defendants, their servants, agents and workmen be restrained during the continuance of Letters Patent Numbers 89819, 95497, 102643 and 107275 from manufacturing, selling or supplying any sweeping compound manufactured according to or in the manner described in the specifications filed in the Patents Office at Ottawa, in the Province of Ontario, Dominion of Canada, in connection with said Letters Patent, of any of them or according to or in any manner only colorably differing from the same, or any of same, and generally from infringing the rights of the Plaintiffs in respect of such Letters Patent of any of them.

AND THIS COURT DOES FURTHER ORDER AND ADJUDGE that there shall be no damages to the Plaintiffs in this action or costs to either party.
