TRADING QUIET AS MONTREAL MARKET OPENS

Consolidated Smelters, Only Feature, Advances 2-3-8 Points to 155-3-8

PRICE MOVEMENTS IN WALL STREET UNEVEN

Fraction Gains Offset by Similar Losses in Some of Leading Issues

MONTREAL, Dec. 21.—Trading was quiet at the opening of today's stock market, the only feature being Consolidated Smelters, which advanced 2 1/2 to 155 3/8. Brazilian followed Smelters in activity, but was unchanged at 90, and Laurentide at 90 1/2. Atlantic Sugar preferred gained 1 to 81 in a single board lot transaction, while Canadian Converters rose 1/4 to 88. The balance of the list was neglected.

IN WALL STREET

NEW YORK, Dec. 21.—Uneven price movements marked the opening of today's stock market, with holiday influences reflected in lessened trading activity. Reactions of a point or more took place in United States Rubber and Chrysler, contrasting with the fractional gains recorded by American Can, American Smelting, California Petroleum and Stewart Warner. Profit taking in a few rail issues failed to halt the upward movement of much standard shares as Atchafalaya, New York Central, and Baltimore and Ohio.

Morning Stock Letter

NEW YORK, Dec. 21.—There is little interest and stocks that have not got a pool backing do not move much one way or the other. There is some liquidation and at the same time considerable short selling from scattered sources. Believe when stocks get down only slightly they over to meet good support. The market is consequently at more or less of a standstill. Do not think, however, that the upward move we expect will be made on the long side. Some of the rails look highest. We are still bullish on Southern Ry., CO. N. Y. C. and B.O. Steels should also have another strong upward move before this market over. We still expect new highs for U. S. Steel, Gt. St. L., B. & O. and look higher. Offerings of stocks have seemingly dried up and we expect this stock to sell at a great deal higher. In the store stocks, we are still bullish on May, Macy and Asa's Dry Goods, and in the oil group, Phillips and Intl. Petroleum.
