

The basement of the hospital is to be remodelled in order that it may be used as a modern out-patient department suitable to the needs of the community, if the nunicipal council approves the necessary expenditure. The out-patient department is an urgent need at the present time and it was the suggestion of the meeting yesterday that a special meeting of the municipal council should be called at an early date in order to consider the tenders and deal with the whole matter of the proposed remodeling.
