Subjects of Her Majesty are required to make a declaration of allegiance before proceeding to their degrees.

Boards of Study in the different Faculties, consisting of ex officio and elected members, advise the Corporation, through the Executive Committee, as to the nomination of Examiners, changes in the Curriculum, etc., in their respective departments.
