It was decided to re-comment that all manufacturers should do everything possible to provent the suspending or dismits-ing of men where it was possible to keep them employed, and that where a reduction of the working time was regarded as necessary, the reducion should be carried out by closing for whole days, nather than for parts of days, so as to minimize factory disargant sation and inconveniences to the workers.
