

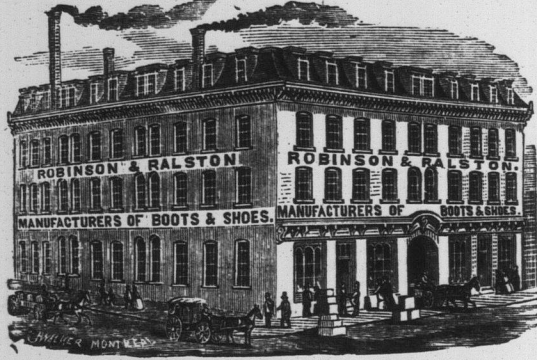

London, Feb. 28.
