MORE FLOODS.

Great Damage to Property, and Loss of Life.
JOHNSTOWN, N. Y., July 20.
Heavy and protracted rains caused overflow of water to burst its bounds Tuesday morning and the village was flooded last night.
The water rose fifteen feet and overflowed every thing.
It has now fallen about eight feet below its highest point.
Ten persons are thus far reported missing and the bodies of four have been recovered.
The latter are Charles Peur, two men named Coakley and Kost, and a fourteen-year-old boy named Steedwell.
The drowned and missing persons were among a crowd of about fifty people who had gathered on a stone bridge at Ferry street when the rising waters.
Suddenly the bridge gave way and they were hurled into the flood.
The bridge was about twenty feet high, and was a single arch structure crossed by the street car track.
Most of the people who were thrown into the water were saved by ropes thrown to them from the shore.
