

MINCHIN, *Lt.-Col. Hon. GEORGE, J. P.*

Has served in the British Army. Was Lieut.-Col. 1st Batt York (N. B.) Militia. Appointed to Leg. Council, 1838.—*Fredericton, N. B.*

MUIRHEAD, *Hon. WILLIAM.*

A merchant. Appointed to Leg. Council, 1867.—*Chatham, N. B.*

PERLEY, *Hon. CHARLES.*

Descended from a loyalist family. B. in Co. Sunbury, N. B. A Lumber merchant and agriculturist. Sat for Carleton in Leg. Assembly, N. B., previous to Union. Appointed to Leg. Council, 1867.—*Woodstock, N. B.*

ROBINSON, *Capt. Hon. JOHN JAMES, J. P.*

Descended from an old Suffolk family; ancestors were bailiffs and magistrates of Dunwich for some generations. Only s. of Capt. J. Robinson, of Hon. E. I. Co.'s service. B. at West Ham, Essex, Eng., Jan., 1811. Ed. at the Grammar Schs. of Broxbourne, Hertfordshire, and Ilford, Essex. M., July, 1839, Cornelia, second dau. of Admiral W. F. W. Owen, of Campobello, N. B., and neice of Sir E. W. C. R. Owen, G.C.B., G.C.H. Entered the Royal Navy in 1824, and served until he retired as Captain on half-pay, 1845 (See *Byrne's Naval Biographical Dictionary*). Is an alderman of Dunwich. Was Commissioner of Light-houses, N. B. Sat. for Charlotte in Leg. Assembly, N. B., from 1850 until appointed to Leg. Council. 1856.—*Campobello, N. B; Windlesham House, Surrey, Eng.; United Service Club, London, Eng.*

RYAN, *Hon. J. H.*

Appointed to the Leg. Council, 1853.—*Studholm, N. B.*
