Fee to be paid for such inspection.

forenoon and three in the afternoon, (Sundays and holidays excepted) in the presence of one of the said Commissioners, without being obliged to pay any fee, provided that the time during which such person may inspect the said lists do not exceed one hour on any one day, and in case such person inspecting the said lists, should occupy more than one hour on any one day in inspecting such lists, he shall pay such Commissioner a fee at the rate of 1s. 6d. for every hour beyond the first hour during which he shall have inspected the same.

Jurors to be taken in rotation.

XIX. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the Jurors who shall have been summoned to give their verdict in the said Circles, (*arrondissemens*) shall be taken in their turn without any exception, following without interruption, and successively the list, beginning with respect to each cause, immediately after the last Jury which shall have been summoned for the preceding cause.

Jurors to be summoned by the Sheriff in certain cases.

XX. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that none of the provisions of this Act respecting the powers given to the said Civil Superior Courts, for making the said lists of Jurors, by the Commissioners appointed to take evidence, shall extend to the Circles (*arrondissemens*) having for their chief places, the Cities of Quebec or Montreal, or to the District of Three Rivers, and that the lists of Jurors to serve in Civil Causes in the said Circles (*arrondissemens*) or in the said District of Three Rivers, shall be made by the Sheriff of the District of Quebec and Montreal, and Three Rivers respectively.

Sheriff to make a list of Jurors.

XXI. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that from and after the passing of this Act the said Sheriff shall make for the said Circles (*arrondissemens*) or Districts respectively in the same manner as herein before prescribed for the Commissioners appointed to take evidence, and shall compose the said lists of the same persons fit and qualified to be Jurors in Causes in the said Circles (*arrondissemens*) or District respectively, and that the said lists shall be deposited in the offices of the Prothonotaries or Clerks of the said Civil Superior Courts of Quebec and Montreal, or for the Provincial Court for the District of Three Rivers respectively, any Law, usage or custom to the contrary notwithstanding.

Such lists to be deposited in the Prothonotaries' Office.

Jurors to be chosen in the Circles where the parties have their domicile.

XXII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that in all cases in which the parties are permitted to demand a trial and the verdict of a Jury, the Jurors shall be taken
