Years at least in the Office of one of the Barristers, Attornies or Solicitors of the said Courts, or shall produce authentic Documents to prove his having been called to the Bar in Great-Britain or Ireland, or in the Colonies, or of his being qualified to be so called, or of his having been admitted to practise as an Attorney or Solicitor in one of the Superior Courts of Law or Equity in Great Britain or Ireland, or the Colonies, or of his being qualified to be so admitted according to the Rules and Regulations of such Courts.

Every Candidate shall be 21 years of age at least and shall undergo an Examination touching his skill in the Law. II. And be it further enacted, That every Candidate for admission, as aforesaid, shall be of the age of Twenty-one Years at least, and shall undergo a strict Examination touching his skill in the Law, and which Examination shall be conducted by His Majesty's Attorney General, or the Solicitor General, for the Island, for the time being, and the senior practising Barrister, in presence of the Judges of the Supreme Court, of which the Chief Justice shall always be one, and in presence of the Chancellor in the Court of Chancery.

Proviso as to Persons who have already qualified. III. Provided always, That nothing herein contained shall be held to affect Persons who have already qualified themselves for Admission to the Office of Barrister and Attorney in the Supreme Court, according to the general Rule of that Court, of Michaelmas Term, in the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Eight, or to the Office of Barrister and Solicitor in Chancery, according to the Practice of that Court.

## CAP. V.

An Act for repealing certain parts of an Act made and passed in the Fourteenth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled An Act for regulating the Measure of Boards, and all other kinds of Lumber, and for appointing Officers to survey the same, and for declaring what shall be deemed Merchantable Timber for Exportation.
