Night flying washed in at 2100 hours.</p> <p>Edenvale: Flying washed in at 0900 hours. Out at 1600 hours. Flying time 25:10 hours.</p> <p>The W.D. softball team triumphed 11-7 over Wybridge in an exhibition match this evening held at Wyebridge.</p> <p>Camp Borden district soccer play-offs got under way this evening at Little Norway with Little Norway triumphing over No. 1 S.F.T.S.</p> <p>No. 1 S.F.T.S. softball nine lost a 13-4 ball game to 13X Depot in a Command playdown encounter.</p> <p>At 1100 hours Harvard 11 2644, while doing aerobatics stalled on top of a loop, flicked into a spin to the right, attempted to recover but the aircraft continued to spin and crashed two miles north of Minesing, Ont.
