Transmit to you by direction of the Lieut. Governor the accompanying speech of the Chief of the Indians under the charge of Mr. McMurray; and I am to request that you will have the goodness to enquire into the subject of the complaints brought forward by the Chief.

From his statement the conduct of the French population, or half Breeds, requires to be investigated. He should be informed, if they continue to molest the Indians, measures will be taken immediately to remove them from the Sault Ste. Marie.

It is the intention of His Excellency to order Captain Anderson to repair to the Sault for the purpose of making a report on the mischief, and on the necessity of removing the Squatters from that place who interrupt the labors of Mr. McMurray. I have
