Right Honourable and Dear Sir:

Yesterday's papers carry a report of the Senate Committee
on Public Health and the news item closes -

The three physicians, the woman senator and the rancher
who constituted the committee drew up a report to the
Senate with the following recommendations:

1. Approval of the calling of a conference of the
Minister of National Health and the provincial minis-
ters of health.
2. Recommending the opportunity be taken to ascer-
tain the conditions of public health throughout the
Dominion.
3. That whilst preserving the provincial jurisdic-
tion in this regard, which is admitted on all sides, the
committee recommends the Government co-operate with the
divers provincial governments.
4. As far as grants are concerned the conference
should be invited to consider the grants made by the
central government and advise as to the maintenance,
increase, decrease or discontinuance of any or all.
