"It is, of course, impossible to enumerate all cases in which an address is appropriate. There is no definite sphere of applicability, the common element is a desire on the part of the House, as representing the nation, to recerd its views on some event in a peculiarly impressive manner. This may be desirable as to events both of domestic and of foreign concern. There seems to be only one direction in which any limitation has been laid down; no address may be presented in relation to any bill depending in either House."
