Sir,

I have to inform you that 5 Bales  
containing 65 pairs of blankets have been  
forwarded to your address by express for such of the most  
aged, sick and infirm Indians of your Agency as you may  
consider best entitled thereto, and for none other. Able bodied  
Indians and those able to procure blankets for themselves  
are not to share in the distribution.

You will be good enough to report to the Department  
at once, whether the number of blankets received by you is  
as stated in this letter.

And after the distribution, you should furnish the  
Department with a statement shewing the names and cir-  
cumstances of the recipients. This should be signed by them  
and certified by yourself and the Chiefs.
