


convenient position between the stove and the chimney. The dormitories and other rooms may also be ventilated to a certain extent, provided there is a large chimney from the ground floor up. If openings are made into this chimney near the floor and shutters provided so that they can be closed if necessary it will be found that a great deal of the impure air will be carried away by this means through the chimney. All the windows should be made so that they can be lowered from the top as well as raised from the bottom.

From the above information in regard to the cubic air space you will be able to calculate the dimensions of your building for forty pupils. I am sending you, under separate cover, a copy of a plan prepared last year for a boarding school for forty pupils on the Sarcee Indian Reserve, Alberta. This plan was not used, but it may be that from it you can get some ideas as to the laying out of your building.
