In reply I beg to say that you may purchase clothing to the value of \$6.00 for each of the following, the son of Mrs. Michael Francis, Charles Melia, an orphan kept by Anthony Clair, Peter 8. Augustine, kept by John Clemente, and for Joseph Dedmm, an orphan kept by John Joseph. In making the purchases you should be guided by the requirements of the War Purchasing Commission.

It is considered in the case of Joseph Dedam that, in order that he may not be kept from school, clothing should be provided for him as well as for the three others mentioned by you.

The guardians should be informed that this dotted ing is given on the distinct understanding that these children attend school regularly, and you will be good enough to report at a later date as to whether they me dont.

You should furnish itemized accounts, in duritcate, properly certified, for the clothing purchased in said
