- Q. What time did you reach the cafe?
- A. Approximately 8.45 o'clock.
- Q. How did you spend your time?
- A. We bought a bottle of Champagne and split it four ways.
- Q. Anything else drunk?
- A. No, sir.
- Q. About what time did you leave the cafe?
- A. 10.45 o'clock.
- Q. Where were you going?
- A. Home, sir.
- Q. To your billets?
- A. Yes, sir.
- Q. I believe you would have to proceed along Chausse du Charleroi to go to your billets on Avenue Brugmann?
- A. Yes, sir.
- Q. While you were on Chausse de Charleroi, on what side of the street were you walking?
- A. Cpl. McIntyre, Cpl. Lowe and myself were walking on the left hand side of the road.
