Dear Mr. Galbraith:

Enclosed please find the following paragraphs taken from a communication which the Commission has received from Mr. Bryan Williams, J. P., Provincial Game Warden, which I think will answer the question which you put to the Chairman a short time ago in regard to shooting privileges accorded to Indians.

"In an organized district an Indian is limited to four deer a year, but only three of any one species, unless he has a special permit from me to exceed this limit."

"In an unorganized district he may kill more than four deer, provided he needs them for food,-- he is not allowed to sell them."
