LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL

To the Honourable

The Minister of Agriculture.

Sir,—I have the honour to submit for your approval, Bulletin No. 10, Dairy Commissioner's Series, entitled 'Creamcry Cold Storage.'

This bulletin is intended to supply a demand for information which comes from creamery owners, concerning the construction and management of creamery cold storages. Much advancement has been made in knowledge concerning cold storage during the past few years, and especially in that branch of the subject which deals with insulation. The plans and recommendations of a few years ago can now be considerably revised, and in some respects to the advantage of the builder.

The data secured from the results of recent experiments conducted by this branch of your department, with various materials and combinations of materials, used for the purpose of insulation, enable us to recommend a rather cheaper, and simpler, conatruction than has hitherto been considered advisable. We hope thus to encourage much improvement in the cold storage at Canadian creameries. The importance of efficient cold storage at our creameries cannot be over-estimated.

I beg to recommend that this bulletin be printed for general distribution.
