CHAPTER 152.

An Act respecting the traffic in Intoxicating Liquors.

SHORT TITLE.

1. This Act may be cited as the Canada Temperance Act. Short title.
R.S., c. 106, s. 1.

INTERPRETATION.

2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,—
- (a) 'intoxicating liquors' includes every spirituous or malt liquor, and every wine, and any and every combination of liquors or drinks that is intoxicating, and any mixed liquor capable of being used as a beverage, and part of which is spirituous or otherwise intoxicating; Interpretation.
'Intoxicating liquors.'
- (b) 'electors' means persons qualified and competent to vote at an election of a member of the House of Commons in the county or city in respect to which the expression is used; 'Electors.'
- (c) 'form' means a form in the schedule of this Act; 'Form.'
- (d) 'county' includes every town, township, parish and other division or municipality, except a city, within the territorial limits of the county, and also a union of counties united for municipal purposes; 'County.'
- (e) as respects the province of Ontario, or any other province in which provisional or temporary judicial districts exist, 'county' includes such provisional or temporary judicial districts; 'County' in Ontario.
- (f) as respects the province of Manitoba, 'county' means the electoral districts therein, as designated by the Representation Act; 'County' in Manitoba.
- (g) as respects the province of British Columbia, until the Province shall have been divided into counties and a regular municipal organization established in each of such counties, 'county' means an electoral district therein, in accordance with the division of the Province for election of members of the House of Commons of Canada, and includes every town, township, parish and other division or municipality within the territorial limits of such electoral district, or within a union of electoral districts where united
