## KITCHEN HELPS.

The bright steel ornaments of your range can be made to shine like new by rubbing with vinegar.

Enameled kitchenware that is burnt and discolored may be easily cleaned by scrubbing with salt, moistened in vinegar.

To prevent an oil stove smelling put three or four pieces of charcoal into the oil and there will not be the slightest smell.

If grease is spilled on the kitchen table sprinkle the stain at once with coarse salt. This prevents the grease from soaking into the wood.

To brighten the inside of a coffee or tea pot, fill with water, add a small piece of soda, and let it boil about forty-five minutes. Rinse thoroughly.

Keep a piece of pumice stone (not soap) by the kitchen sink to use in scraping dishes. It is effective even when a wire dishcloth fails, and may be used on ware that the wire would injure.

Common tacks are useful for cleaning carafes and bottles. Put a few of these—broken ones will do—in the bottle with a little soapy water and shake briskly. The sharp edges will scrape off all the stains.

## City and Country Girls.

The girl who as bookkeeper, clerk, stenographer, milliner or teacher in her village home receives a weekly salary of \$5, \$6 or \$7 is far better off financially than the girl in the same occupation in the city who gets \$9, \$10 or \$12 a week. In the first place the living expenses are much smaller in the country than in the city—one gets very much more for her money in the way of home comforts; the wear and tear of clothing is much less and as a rule the work less harassing to the nerves, since there is not the same hurry and rush, keeping brain and nerves stretched to the tightest possible tension, so that after the day's work is over one is too tired to go in search of enjoyment. Working long hours at muscle wearying, brain wearing, nerve racking tasks in shops, offices, counting rooms and stores causes the city working girl to long for rest above everything else, and in itself precludes the chances of her making desirable acquaintances except such as may be offered through church affiliations, and even these she is too tired to improve.

## Thin Feet No Longer Desirable.

Thin feet when to have thin feet was the great desire of all womankind. The athletic girl has changed all that, and by the next generation feminine extremities will have grown to almost classical dimensions. As it is shape, not size, that makes or mars the beauty of a foot, this evolution is very desirable, proving as it does that the change is owing to the healthy outdoor life of the modern girl. She is so much on her feet that she does not think of squeezing them into shoes a size too small for her. Never was foot wear prettier than it is at present. Well shaped shoes are within the limits of the most modest income, and as for the stockings they are simply dreams. With the demand for larger shoes the stockings have also grown in size until where 8, 8½ and 9 were worn five years ago the call today is for 9½, 10 and 10½.

## Carry the Head Gracefully.

A double chin can be corrected by proper breathing. The woman with a short neck should hold her head high. Deep, systematic breathing is the best remedy for stoutness, for the great amount of oxygen taken into the lungs burns out the carbon, which is fat. The best time for this exercise is just before dressing and just after undressing. Tight clothes and lacing make a woman appear stouter, and any ideas to the contrary are delusions. Tight fitting garments accentuate the lines of the body, making stoutness more conspicuous. All women can learn to carry their bodies gracefully. It is merely a matter of throwing out the chest, drawing in the chin and walking on the balls of the feet. When these three rules are observed it would be rather difficult to walk ungracefully.—American Queen.

## Blankets.

Blankets can be beautifully washed in cold water and borax, although I know I am challenging the questioning wrath of many a housewife by saying cold instead of hot water. But experience is an inflexible and not to be evaded teacher. Just try my way and see if it is not preferable to toiling over tubs of steam. Use a tablespoonful of powdered borax to each pail of water. Rub the blankets thoroughly, using a little good soap on every soiled place. Rinse well and hang by the edge in the sun. They are as soft as new when dry.—St. Louis Globe-Democrat.

## A Novel Shoe Bag.

Shoe bags are usually noted more for utility than beauty. Something quite novel in this line is also pretty enough to hang in the corner of the room if closet space be lacking. On a flat, triangular piece of stout goods is stitched four pockets, cut like the sections of a parasol, and setting out like one half opened. An old parasol handle is fastened down the center of the back and serves to hang it up by. Cretonne, denim and gray green linen are good materials.

## Mending Broken China.

The Chinese method of mending broken china is to grind thin glass on a painter's stone till it is reduced to an impalpable powder. Then beat it with the white of an egg to a froth and lay it on the edge of the broken pieces, match and bind them together firmly and let them remain several weeks. It is not at all likely it will ever break again in the same place.
