ELISHA AT DOTHAN

2 Kings 6: 8-23-Memory Verses, 15-17.

Golden Text-The angel of the Lord encampeth round about them that fear him, and delivereth them .- Psalm 34: 7.



8 Then the king of Sy ria warred against Is rael, and took counsel with his servants, saying, In such and such a place shall be my camp.

9 And the man of God sent unto the king of Is'rael, saying, Beware that thou pass not such a place; for thither the Sy'rians are come down.

11 Therefore the heart of the king of Sy'ria was sore troubled for this thing; and he called his servants, and said unto them, Will ye not shew me which of us is for the king of Is'rael?

12 And one of his servants said, None, my lord, O king; but Ell'sha, the prophet that is in Is'rael, telleth the king of Is'rael the words that thou speakest in thy bedchamber.

13 And he said, Go and spy where he is, that I may send and fetch him. And it was told him, saying, Behold, he is in Do than.

14 Therefore sent he thither horses, and chariots, and a great host: and they came by night, and compassed the city about.

15 And when the servant of the man of God was risen early, and gone forth, behold, an host compassed the city both with horses and chariots. And his servant said unto him, Alas, my master! how shall we do?

to the man whom ye seek. But he led them to Sama'ria.

20 And it came to pass, when they were come into Sama'ria, that Eli'sha said, Lord, open the eyes of these men, that they may see. And the Lord opened their eyes, and they saw; and, behold, they were in the midst 21 And the king of Is'rael said unto Eli'sha, when he saw them, My father, shall I smite them? shall I smite

22 And he answered, Thou shalt not smite them: wouldest thou smite those whom thou hast taken captive with thy sword and with thy bow? set bread and water before them, that they may eat and crink, and go to their master.

23 And he prepared great provision for them: and when they had eaten and drunk, he sent them away, and they went to their master. So the bands of Sy'ria came no more into the land of Is'rael.

THE LESSON RETOLD

The Syrians were among the strongest enemies of Israel. But it often happened, when the King of Syria would send his army to fight against the Israelites, that Elisha would warn the King of Israel where the Syrians were about to encamp, in time for them to be chased out of the country.

Not knowing how his plans were discovered, the King of Syria began to suppose that there was a traitor in his own camp, who helped the Israelites, until one of his servants said, "It is none other than Elisha the prophet, who is at the bottom of the trouble. By some strange power he tells the King of Israel all our secrets." "Then he must be taken prisoner, and if possible put to death," answered the king.

So the Syrians came by night and surrounded the hill-town of Dothan where Elisha was staying, and when in the early morning Elisha's servant went out, he saw the whole valley full of Syrians, and came in crying, "Alas, master! what shall become of us?" But Elisha answered, "Fear not, there are more on our side than on theirs." And Elisha prayed and said, "O Lord, open the eyes of my servant, that he may see." Then when the young man looked, he saw that the whole mountain between the prophet's house and the valley was filled with horses and chariots of fire, ready to protect his master and himself from the Syrians.

Then Elisha prayed that the Lord would send blindness among the Syrians, and when
