

DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIES, Ottawa, Oct. 44, 1879. Public notice is hereby given that the following provisions, which shall be held to apply to the lands in the Province of Manitoba, and in the Territories to the west and north west thereof, are substituted for the Regulations, disted the oth Jaji ylast, governing the mode of disposing of the Public Landssituate within 110 (one hundred and ten) more on each side of the line of the Cs-nadian Pacific Bail way, which said Regulations are here by superseded :--

are hereby superseded:--1. • Cotil further and final survey of the said railway has been made west of the Red River, and for the purposes of these provisions, the line of the said railway shall be assumed to be on the fourth base westorfy to the intersection of the said base by the line between ranges 21 and 22 west of the first pricipal meridian, and thence in a direct line to the confluence of the Shell River with the River Assimibols.

2. "The country lying on each side of the line of railway shall be respectively divided into belts, as follows:-

"(1) A beit of five miles on either side of the raiway, and immediately adjoining the same, to be called Belt A.

"(2) A belt of fifteen miles on either side of the railway, adjoiring Belt A, to be called Belt B. "(3) A belt of twenty miles on either side of the railway, adjoining Belt B, to be called Belt C.

"(4) A belt of twenty miles on either side of the railway, adjoining Beit C, to be called Belt D;

"(5) A balt of fifty miles on either side of the railway, adjoining Belt D, to be called Belt E.

3. "The even-numbered sections in each hown, ship throughout the several beits above described shall be open for entry as homesteads and pre-emptions of 169 acres each respectively.

4. "The odd-numbered sections in each of such townships shall not be open to homestess or pre-emption, but shall be specially reserved and designated as Hailway Lands.



"These provisions shall be retroactive so far as relates to any and all entries of Homestend and Pre-emption Lands, or sales of Kallway Lands obtained or made under the Regulations of the 9th of July, hereby superseded; any payments made in excess of the rate hereby fixes shall be credited on account of sales of such lands.

"Claims to Public Lands arising from set-lanent after the date hereof. in territory unsur-veyed at the time of such settlement, and which may be embraced within the limits affected by the above policy, or by the extension thereof in the future over additional territory, will be ulti-mately dealt with in accordance with the terms prescribed above for the lands in the particular belt in which such settlement may be found to be strater, subject to the operation of sub-sec-tion of section 11 of these provisions."

"All entries after the date hereof of unoc-cupied lands in the Saskatchewan Agency will be considered as provisional until the railway line through that part of the territorise has been located, after which the same will be finally dis-posed of in accordance with these provisions, as the same may apply to the particular belt in which such lands may be found to be situated, subject, as abova, to ine operation of sub section c of section 11 of these provisions.

"With a view to encouraging settler ent by cheapening the cost of building material, the Government reserves the right to grant licenses, renewable yearly, under Section 52 of the 'Do-minion Lands Act, 1879, to est merchantable tim-ber on any lands situated within the several beits above described, and aviation pettlement upon, or sale of lands within, the territory covered by such licenses, shall for the being be sub-ject to the operation of such licenses.

15. "The absve provisions, it will, of course, be understood, will not affect sections 11 and 29, which are public schoel lands, or sections 3 and 26, Hudson s Pay Company's lands.
