HE GIVES THE IRISH RELIEF MOVEMENT A FRIENDLY HAND.

Brooklyn, January 19.—About \$500 was distributed at the Tabernacle yesterday for the relief of Irish distress. Rev. Mr. Talmage said: "If my family were starving, and by theft, or robbery, or force of farms I could procure them food, I would not hesitate to. I will not finish the sentence, but let me say my prayer is that I be not led into temptation. Again we should assist Ireland in her hour of need, because her people have particular claims upon us here in the United States.
