A Message from the House of Assembly, by Mr. Mabey.

"Mr. President,

"The House of Assembly have agreed to the amendments proposed by his Majesty's Council to the bill intituled "an act to continue and amend an act of the 6th of the present King, intituled an act to regulate the performance of Statute Labour on the Highways, and to suspend an act made and passed in the 35th year of the late King, intituled an act to alter and amend the High Road Laws."

"The House of Assembly have passed a bill intituled "an act for raising a fund by an Assessment on Land, to defray the expense of erecting a Go-

vernment House in this Island."

"Also, a bill intituled "an act to continue and alter an act made and passed in the 8th year of his present Majesty's reign, intituled an act to revive, after and continue an act made and passed in the sixth year of his present
