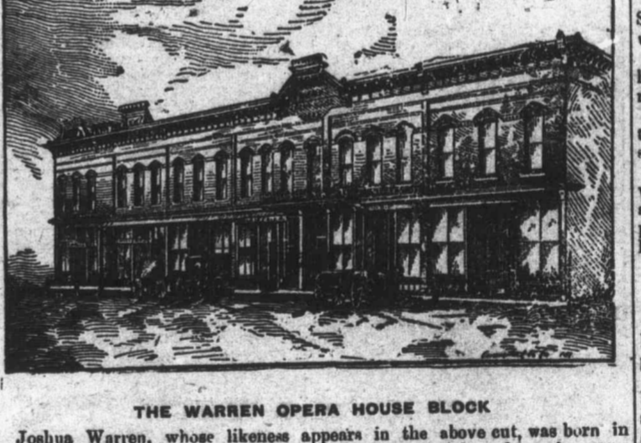

JOSHUA WARREN
A Leeds County Boy Who Has Made a Home and Fortune in the Western States.

About twenty-seven years ago, Joshua Warren, then an energetic and ambitious young man, left his father's farm, about two miles north of the village of Elgin, in this county, to seek his fortune. He first apprenticed himself to David Mansell, of Farnersville, as a dry goods clerk. Tiring of his monotonous occupation, he soon engaged with P. W. Strong and commenced to make cheese for that gentleman in a little factory built in one end of the late Philip Wing's woodshed, about a half a mile east of Athens, then Farnersville. Here he made cheese for several seasons and finally drifted to the town of Brockville where he entered in the commission business. For a time he was very successful and amassed quite a competence, but several large failures of parties with whom he did business left him at the foot of the ladder. Hearing of the many advantages offered to men of pluck and business ability in the western states, he decided to pull up stakes, and start for the state of Nebraska, settling in the little village of Friend, Saline Co., Neb. This was in 1878, and since



then by business tact and perseverance he has amassed more than a snug competence. In 1885 he erected the Warren Opera Block at a cost of \$40,000. This block is 90x140 feet, two stories in height. The lower, or ground story, has six fine stores 25x30 feet; over these stores Mr. Warren has an opera house, capable of comfortably seating 700 people. There are also on this flat several fine office rooms. Mr. Warren occupies two of the stores himself and carries a stock of \$25,000 in dry goods and clothing. The fine residence of Mr. Warren shown in the accompanying cut was erected in 1890 at a cost of over \$5,000, and while he has not expended very much money for outside extras or show, yet he has a very commodious and comfortable home. Besides these, he has large landed interests in the neighborhood of Friend which he has placed in such shape that they yield a nice income.

Joshua Warren, whose likeness appears in the above cut, was born in 1843. He had two brothers who counted their birthdays from the same date, or, in other words, he was a triplet. The triplets were named Caleb, Joshua and David. David was killed several years ago in Pennsylvania by a falling tree, and the other brother, Caleb, lives at Onataga, N. Y. The family consisted of six girls and four boys, all of whom are living but two. Joshua married a daughter of Justice Dose, of Elgin. The Telegraph of Friend, Nebraska, paid Mr. Warren this tribute in an editorial last fall: "Mr. Warren is a public spirited man and his purse strings are always opened for the furthering of any object for the public good."
