LABOR DAY EVENTS.

The last general Dominion holiday of the year falls due tomorrow. While it is known as Labor Day, all the people of the Dominion join in, and probably no holiday of the year is more generally and enthusiastically enjoyed. And tomorrow there are an unusual number of attractions locally. The Mine Rescue Association are having a full day on the Cricket Grounds. The object of the Association is to promote knowledge of mine rescue work and first aid among the miners, and it speaks volumes for the interest of the men in this work that so many of them should take it up. The Association has an annual field meeting every year, and this tomorrow makes the fourth. There are competitions in all the branches of rescue work, and there are no fewer than fifteen teams entered for tomorrow's events, two of them are from across the line.

The meet has therefore something of an international character, and some keen contests should be witnessed. There are other sports and the Silver Cornet Band will be in attendance all the afternoon.

South Wellington is also celebrating the holiday with a big field meeting. Nanaimo and Ladysmith have both had their big days, and South Wellington is rightly and properly holding a celebration of its own. The people of South Wellington have contributed to the success of the celebrations held here and in Ladysmith, and no doubt they will receive the same support from the citizens of Ladysmith and Nanaimo.

In addition to these two big field meetings there are various picnics, and the local lodge of Foresters are marking a day of it. There will be the usual dances in the evening and outside of town it may be mentioned that the Parkville people are holding a Labor Day dance.
