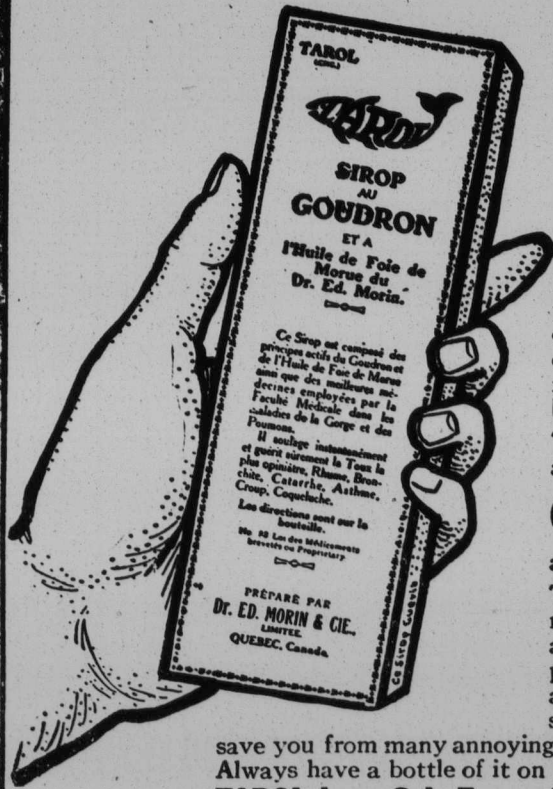

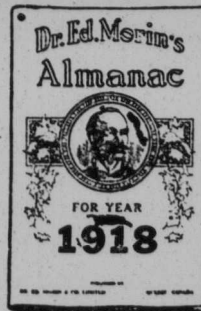

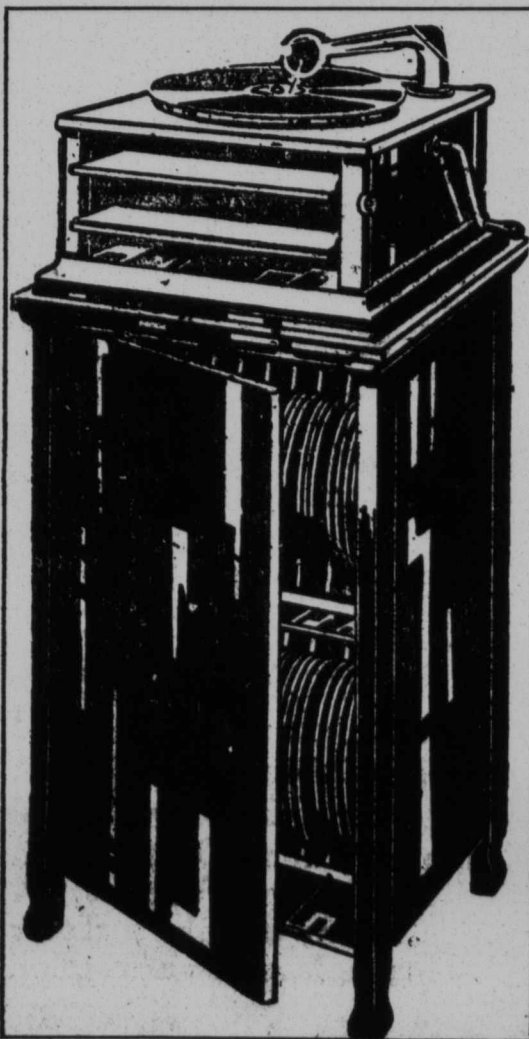
London, Dec 22—The Cologne Gazette comments on the Halifax disaster as follows:

UP HIS LIFE

Mr and Mrs James O'Shea of Boom Road, have received a telegram from Ottawa informing them that their son, Pte Wm O'Shea was killed in action on November 29th. Pte O'Shea was only seventeen years of age when in July 1915, he enlisted in the 145th battalion for overseas. He crossed to England in September and on arrival at office work, but he would not stay at the job, and volunteered for the front, and went to France last September. Before enlisting Pte O'Shea was a bright and popular student of St Thomas' College, and which has sent quite a number of boys to the front.
