

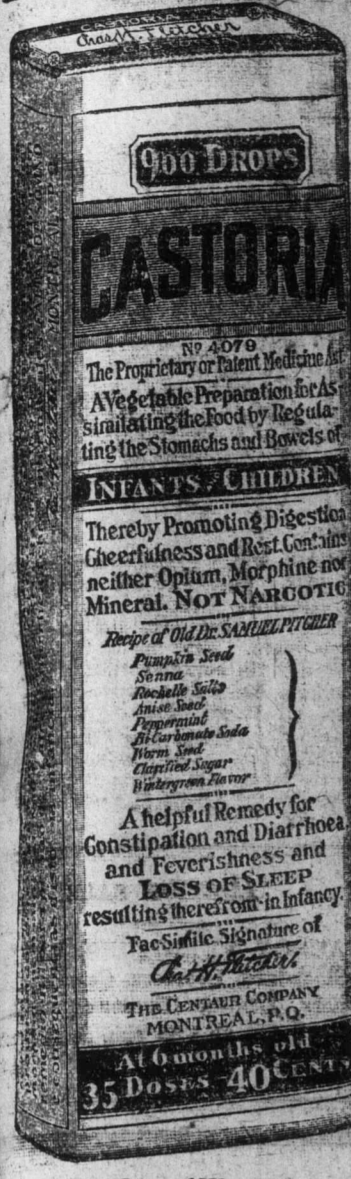

PICKETS OF ERIN'S CAUSE TURN UPON SECRETARY COLBY

BEAR BANNERS BEFORE STATE DEPARTMENT—ARRESTED— FOUR OUT ON BAIL

WASHINGTON, April 8.—Bearing banners inscribed with quotations said to be taken from a recent speech by Secretary Colby, the Irish pickets today transferred their activities from the British embassy to the state department.

During the busiest hour of the afternoon the pickets presented to the gaze of homeward bound war workers banners bearing the quoted inscriptions. "There is not even a scintilla of legality in England's claim to rule Ireland."

"The death of your martyrs has called into existence millions of Irish by principle."

"I cannot stand by mute and powerless while these voice offerings are laid upon the altar of patriotism."

The banner bearers said the statements attributed to Secretary Colby were taken from his address at Carnegie Hall, New York, May 14, 1916. At the end of an hour the pickets withdrew to their headquarters. A squad of police appeared on the scene as soon as the banners were erected but no effort was made to interfere with the picketing.

Resumption of the patrol in front of the British embassy has been definitely postponed until after the trial next Monday of the four pickets now under arrest. Arraigned before United States Commissioner Richardson the quartette was released on \$1,000 bail, pleading not guilty to a violation of section 4062, revised statutes, in having "feloniously" encroached bodily and by violence the person of his excellency, the councillor of the embassy and charge d'affaires of Great Britain, the on. Ronald C. Lindsay."

One of the four prisoners was pronounced "indisposed" after her release from detention.

"Just an attack of woman's nerves," her colleagues said.

None of the women offered any complaint against the food and lodging afforded them at the house of detention. Plenty of Irish potatoes, they said, were offered them besides Hungarian goulash and New England family dinners.


FIVE DIE AT FRANKFORT

**QUESTION WILL GROW OLD
WAITING PREMIER'S RETURN**

OTTAWA, April 8.—Sir George Foster in the House to-day intimated to J. A. Campbell, Nelson, that if a question he had asked awaited the return of the Prime Minister it would become a very old question. Mr. Campbell desired to know whether the Prime Minister, prior to the election of 1911, had made a pledge that if his party was successful in the election he would have transferred to the Provinces of Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba their natural resources. Sir George Foster, Acting Premier, replied that he was not aware whether such a pledge had been made or not. Mr. Campbell then suggested that the question might stand until the return of the Prime Minister.

"It will be very old then," commented Sir George.
