## Held for \$150,000 Ransom--U. S. Senate and Peace Treaty--Kaiser and Crown Prince Intriguing With German Royalists.

### BRITISH MUNITIONS.

VLADIVOSTOK, Oct. 17. General Knox, chief of the British Military mission, in a statement to the Russian Telegraph agency at Omsk, says Great Britain has furnished the Siberians and General Denikin with great quantities of munitions, hundreds of thousands of rifles, hundreds of millions of cartridges, hundreds of big guns and thousands of machine guns, as well as several hundred thousand sets of uniforms and equipment. Each cartridge fired this year by these Russian soldiers was made in England by English workmen from English material, the supplies being shipped to Russia on English steamers.

### INTRIGUING FOR REINSTATEMENT.

LONDON, Oct. 22. The former German Emperor and Crown Prince are concerned in the intrigues of the German Royalists, the political correspondent of the Daily Mail asserts. The ex-Emperor, says the writer, is far from leading a life of detachment from German affairs. He has recently seen a number of mysterious visitors from Germany, and is receiving many telegrams. He is constantly in communication with some place in Germany by telephone, a private line having been attached to his residence across the frontier. The communications are with German Royalists. The former Crown Prince is also known to be intriguing with German Royalists and receiving many suspicious visitors. Inquiries on this matter will be made in the House of Commons this week.

### REVISED RESERVATIONS ADOPTED.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 22. Four revised reservations to the Peace Treaty were adopted to-day by the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, with the administration leaders voting solidly against them. The committee also adopted a preamble to the reservations providing that the treaty should not become effective until three of its principal and Allied Associated Powers had agreed to the Senate's reservations. This too was opposed by the administration senators.

### HIGH COMMISSIONER AT VIENNA.

LONDON, Oct. 22. Frank Oswald Lindley, son of Lord Lindley, has been appointed British High Commissioner at Vienna to look after British affairs until an ambassador is named and regular diplomatic relations are resumed. This announcement was made officially to the Associated Press to-night. Francis Lindley served as Counsellor of the Embassy at Petrograd.

### LIBAU SURROUNDED.

LIBAU, Oct. 22. The Germans have surrounded the town, and nothing is allowed to pass through their line. The bread ration has been cut.

### ASHAMED OF HIS FACE.

BERLIN, Oct. 21. Former Emperor William has commissioned Attorney Siebert, of Berlin, to institute a suit against the actor Frederick Bonn, who prepared what are known as the "Kaiser films," which were barred in Berlin but were permitted to be exhibited elsewhere. The emperor charges insult and the misuse of his portrait and ask for the impression of the films. The Bonn film referred to in the foregoing was to have been produced in Berlin on Oct. 10, but was suppressed by Government order on the date the title of the pic-

tures was announced as "Wilhelm's good fortune and bad finish." The Government announcement said the suppression grew out of a desire to prevent the film being made a cause for political combats at a time when party feeling already was at a high pitch.

### LOOKING AFTER THE COLONIES.

LONDON, Oct. 22. Speaking here to-day Viscount Milner, Secretary of State for the Colonies, observed that some of the Dominions were becoming interested in the colonies nearest them and thought the tendency was worthy of encouragement. He said he intended to get all the money possible for the development of the colonies although there were difficulties in these days of rampant economy.

### MUST HAVE WIRELESS.

OTTAWA, Oct. 22. All Canadian ships sailing for ports in the United Kingdom will be obliged in future to carry a wireless installation and wireless operators in order to conform to the requirements of an act passed by the British Parliament.

### ORGANIZED LABOR WITHDRAWS.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 22. Organized labor to-night through its leader, Samuel Gompers, announced its withdrawal from the national industrial conference, which had been in conference here since Oct. 6th to establish a new relationship between capital and labor.

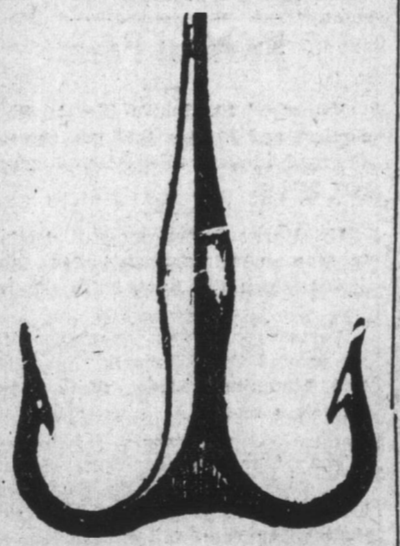
