RUSSIA BUYING FLOUR; WILL GO

VIA BLACK SEA.

"Russia is coming into the export flour market. While no business is reported to have been done locally, it is stated that some good business has transpired across the border, some of the Canadian article figuring in the deals. At New York this week freight room has been engaged for 4,000 tons of flour (40,000 barrels) for shipment to a Russian Black Sea port. It seems to be the general impression that this contract represented the first purchase of importance for the Russian relief work, although for the Russian relief work, although this has not been definitely stated. The flour is expected to move within the next two weeks and shipment will be made to the port of Batum, at the eastern extremity of the Black Sea in the Trans-Caucasian district.
