### Female 'Jack the Ripper'

Marie Lacoste, known in the Paris underworld as the "Tigress of La Chapelle," has at last been caught and brought to face charges of stabbing women victims to death. The adventures of this woman are typical of the life among the Apaches and thieves of the quarter called La Chapelle. Marie, who was born 33 years ago at Saint Denis, for the past 10 years has been considered by the police to be the virago incarnate of La Chapelle. In 1913, Marie Lacoste

is alleged to have killed, with a knife her first victim. This was a young woman named Marie Lefevre. The "tigress" disappeared for a while from her usual haunts, but a few months later two other unfortunate girls who had been seen in her company were found dead with terrible knife cuts in their bodies. Chief Police-Inspector Leroy finally located her in a beautiful country pavilion at La Varenne, St. Hilaire. With her was a pretty girl, Helene Martel, formerly of Paris. Leroy and another officer raided the place, and had to kill two savage bull-dogs before getting into the house. Marie Lacoste fought like a tigress, wielding her big knife with the skill of a Sioux Indian, but the policemen finally overpowered the two women and finally took them handcuffed to the motor car waiting outside. Helene Martel had been slightly injured in the encounter with the police, and was taken to hospital pending the trial of Marie Lacoste. The "tigress" herself was locked up in St. Lazare prison. There she remained for several weeks. She engaged some of the best lawyers in Paris, and secured her temporary freedom.

New York, June 15.—Jack Britton, former world's champion welterweight, won the judges' decision over Soldier Bartfield, of New York, in a ten-round bout here last night. Britton knocked Bartfield down with a right to the jaw shortly after the bell rang in the second round, but Bartfield did not take a count.

McTIGUE AND SIKI AGAIN.

Babylon, N.Y., June 14.—Mike McTigue to-day signed articles to meet Battling Siki in a return bout at Dublin on September 5. The agreement was reached between Dr. Patrick McCartan, of Dublin, representing Siki, and Joe Jacobs, McTigue's manager. McTigue will receive \$100,000 for his end of the purse, it was said.

A REPORT FROM LOS ANGELES.

Los Angeles, June 13.—Jack Dempsey was recently knocked out by a negro sparring partner, and has been neglecting his training, according to reports brought to Los Angeles, the champion's home town, yesterday, by Walter Miller, wrestling instructor of the Los Angeles Athletic Club. Miller told the United News he received this information from Jim Johnson, Mayor of Shelby, Mont., in Portland, Oregon, a few days ago. Miller says that the odds of the Gibbons-Dempsey fight have tumbled to even money in the Northwest States, and that many were betting that Gibbons would win by a knockout. The man who is alleged to have knocked out the champion is "Kid" Godfrey, negro heavyweight of New York. "I had a long talk with Johnson and Mike Collins," said Miller. "Johnson did not mince words in discussing the manner in which Dempsey is training for his bout. He said that Godfrey put over an unexpected sock on the chin, and Dempsey was falling when Godfrey realized what he had done and grabbed the champion. It was a full minute before they were able to get Dempsey to his feet so that he was able to stand unaided."

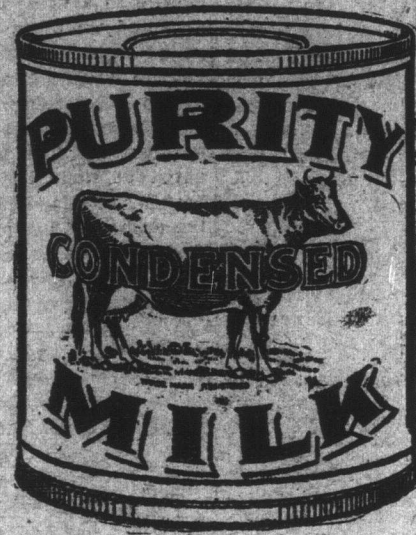

### Nature's Carpet of Jewels.

WONDERS OF A PINCH OF SEA-SHORE SAND.

The sand upon which you may be basking as you read this article is not a ready-made article, nor does it find its way to the beach in a haphazard way. Sand is one of Nature's most finished products. It is the result of countless thousands of years of ceaseless work, and a wondrous compound of a myriad ingredients.

No two sands are quite alike, though they may look and feel much the same as you walk over them.

Take a handful of that which surrounds you, and spread it out and examine carefully the tiny particles of which it consists. Many will be little stones; others are fragments of shells; and if you have sharp eyes you may find amongst them numbers of beautiful unbroken shells, varying in size from that of the smallest pin's head to that of a pea.

The smallest shells must be seen under a magnifying glass before their full beauty can be appreciated. They are the discarded homes of tiny creatures, who formed them into perfect cups and twists and spirals, and had the skill, even in the small space available, to introduce a wondrous scheme of gay colours.

The stones are infinite in their variety. As the sun falls upon them they glitter and flash like so many jewels. Many of them are jewels—little chips of the less precious stones such as corneal and the different crystals. Others are quartz, flint, or granite. But you will notice one thing about all of them—their edges are beautifully smooth. That is why it is so pleasant to ramble barefoot over the shore, for the tiny rounded grains feel as soft as a carpet.

What is Nature's method of making this mixture? Briefly, it is this. She hurls the waters of the sea at the feet of the great cliffs which guard the land. The force of tides and storms is so irresistible that as attack follows attack the stoutest rocks are chipped and cracked.

To aid the waters she makes use of boring shellfish, whose file-like

languages weaken the stones by eating tunnels into them. As the centuries pass—and time to Nature is a thing that does not matter—fragments large and small are torn from the rocks and fall to the beach below.

Here they are rolled and ground and rattled against each other by the tides, being split gradually into smaller pieces, and having all their edges worn smooth by their constant movement. Only a few chips have been wrenched from the cliffs the work of the tide comes easier; the water picks up these fragments and hurls them like battering rams at the rocks.

Tricks of the Tide.

And now Nature begins to sort out her ingredients and arrange the stones so that they are graduated in order of size. You will find close to the cliffs a coarse gravel composed of stones as big as oranges. Nearer the water's edge they grow less and less in size. Coarse gravel is followed by fine; fine gravel by sand. As the stones are split and torn the larger fragments resist the pull of the water and therefore remain close to the cliffs; the smaller ones roll farther out with receding tides. During a storm the waters of a sandy bay may look like pea soup owing to the tiny fragments they are carrying.

In some places the tides pick up the sand and remove it as fast as it is made, carrying it away to deposit it on the other reaches. That is why some shores are sandy whilst others are not. And when Nature lays down her carpet of sand she mingles with it the shells great and small for which her tiny creatures have no further use.
