Miraculous Escape From Death

MOTOR CAR CRASHES INTO TRAIN BUT OCCUPANTS OF CAR ES-CAPE UNINJURED.

Mount Pearl on Friday afternoon, Mr. Scott, the officer in charge at the Count Pearl Wireless Station and his wife barely missed instant death. Shortly after 3 o'clock, Mr. Scott and his wife having purchased their week's supply of groceries started for Mount Pearl Wireless Station. SIDE ON COLLISION.

With great presence of mind Mr. Scott swerved his car to the left so that the oncoming train which was travelling at a rate of between 30 and 35 miles per hour ripped along the side of the machine, smashing both wheels and axles and driving some of the iron work a foot deep into the ground. The train was pulled up after having travelled about fifty yards, hen the crew went back and expect ed to find that the occupants of the car had received serious injury, they were surprised that Mr. and Mrs. Scott had suffered only a few bruises from the severe shock.

The signal cannot be seen, and if the wind is in it is very difficult to hear the engineers warnning. #### **World Leaders Might** Make Peace Possible

Only by the united efforts of business men, statesmen, educationalists and journalists throughout the world to create and produce the will to peace, "can there be achieved recovery and reconstruction of a thorough and abiding kind," Sir Esme Howard, British Ambassador, told the Chamber of Commerce of the United States in an address at its annual convention. To the same end they must work, also, the ambassador declared, to remove the desire for revenge on the other, and to show that, while accepting the ordinary competition of trade, which is a part of the natural order of things, no nation desires to take any unfair and improper advantage of the other. The subject of influence of international co-operation on trade, Sir Esme said, is one to which too little

attention is perhaps paid by those who give up their time mainly to

International trade, which, he said as been too often the provocation o war, should henceforth be pursued along lines which would make it ra ther an influence for peace.
