#### Englishman and Wife Sentence

MR. AND MRS. HALEY MORRIS

LEWES, Eng., Dec. 17-Charged with luring girls to their lonely counwealthy Haley Morriss and his wife were convicted and sentenced to im-

prisonment. Morriss, scion of an eminent family, was ordered to two years of hard labor besides 12 months of ordinary imprisonment, and costs, while his young wife, whom he married after the scandal of his "white slave castle." leaked out, was sentenged to fine months at hard labor. She collapsed at the verdict and had to be carried

from the court. Morriss, it was claimed, had occapled the Crow's nest a house on his magnificent estate, Pipping Ford Park, Nutley, Sussex, with Eliza Phyllis Roberts, 20. Miss Roberts, according to the testimony, had brought her sister, about 16 years old, to the "white slave estate," and had induced her to yield to Morriss.

#### Not Only One.

The girl was, however, not the only one lured there with Miss Roberts' aid. Testimony showed that other girls, some of them scarcely more than children, had been brought to the Crow's Nest on one pretext and another, whereupon the Roberts girl influenced them to submit to Morriss. One girl from Putney told the jury a pitiful-story of being a virtual prisoner in the Crow's Nest, where she had been plied with Miss Roberts' pleas. Finally, in a moment when she was not watched, she had made her way off the great estate and telephoned girls concerning her plight. Then she started her way back home and was picked up by a friendly autoist. Her revelations led to the arrest of the pair and subsequently Miss Roberts, who had previously posed as housekeeper for Morriss, was married
