It provides that no person holding office under the Dominion or the Province shall be eligible as a member of the Assembly, excepting of course the members of the Executive Council of Ontario, and, after the example of Britain, officers of Her Majesty's army and navy, and all members of the militia not receiving permanent salaries. The bill likewise disqualifies Senators, Privy Councillors and pub lie contractors, and makes the penalty for violation of the statute \$2,000 per day for every day an ineligible pers may sit and vote. Any member of the Executive Council who resigns his office, and within one month takes any other office in said Council shall not be held to have vacated his seat in the Assembly; and any member of the Executive Council who sits or votes in the House of Commons shall forfeit his office as Councillor. The Bill in its present form grants much that was re-quired; a slight effort of generosity would make it include all.
