on their different parishes or the municipality. One case mentioned was that of a woman who was so impoverished and weak from lack of proper nourishment that her child died from her inability to succor it. In another family the father had struggled against fate and sickness for a number of years. He was an honest fellow and worked when he could, and often when he should not. Then he died, and left the burden of the support of a family of four young children to a sick wife, who can only get two half-days' work a week. Another Englishman of the parish has a large family to support, but is unable to work on account of a nervous trouble. Doctors say he is a fit subject for the Home for Incurables, yet he and his wife manage to eke out a living, in the summer time at least, by selling what few vegetables they can raise. There are several families the heads of which are able-bodied tradesmen who have not had two months' work in two years. Some actually came to the rector and plainly asked for bread. One woman was proferred assistance, and although she needed it badly she asked that it be given to Mrs. C-, on William street, whose husband had recently died. In one family the husband was out of work and the family was greatly excited because the landlord threatened to evict them for back rent. They went to their pastor for assistance. "But what can I do?" asked Mr.

Hill. "I can't pay rent." Mr. Hill advocates the forming of a central relief or charity committee to combat with what will no doubt be a serious condition of affairs next winter. In the summer time there is a chance of a few days work now and again, and the condition of affairs is nothing to what it will be. The parish of St. John the

Evangelist does not stand alone.
