#### RUSSIA'S BIG FORCE IN THE FAR EAST

Massing Troops for the Second War With the Japanese.

Victoria, B. C., Sept. 17.—Russia is massing a great army in Siberia, Four or five barracks are being built and extensive fortifications made, and speculation as to the second war with Japan is a common topic of conversation among the Russian military men, said A. B. Denbigh, a Russian, who returned from Siberia and Mongolia by the steamer Kagamaru today. "I was told that there were at least five hundred thousand troops in Siberia," said Mr. Denbigh. "Troops are quartered everywhere. The number of troops are from four to five times the number in Siberia before the war. At Vladivostok, before I left, there was a review of fifty-five thousand troops, and not one man was taken from the fortifications. I suppose at least as many more could have been paraded."



### THAT NEW RACE TRACK
