John L. Alexander declared that the

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PLEDGES SUPPORT

TO HOME PRODUCTS

Board of Trade Will Wage

Campaign for German

Trade.

Members Advised To Get in

Touch With Government

Purchasing Agent.

LONDON'S Board of Trade last night

pledged itself to do everything in its

power to secure the trade formerly held

by Germany, and to help, by supplying

money, men and material, in bringing

about the fulfillment of Britain's object

—peace in Europe, with honor to the

Empire.

The board pledged itself to accomplish

this by the unanimous adoption of a

resolution offered by E. E. Leonard.

The presentation of this motion fol-

lowed the consideration and discussion

of various methods by which Canada

could take advantage of the present dis-

order of German trade to develop her

own business and her commerce with

other countries.

A letter was received from the presi-

dent of the British Imperial Council

of Commerce, which is practically a

connecting link between the various

branches of commerce and the board
