can be expected. **COMMUNISTS IN** FIERCE FIGHT AT GATES OF PARIS Brown and Cotter; Morgan, Brown

Serious Outbreaks Mar Celebration of Lifting of Siege of Orleans.

PARIS, May 8 .- There was considerable disorder today in Paris and in other places during the celebration of the anniversary of the lifting of the siege of Orleans by Joan of Arc in

Fourteen policemen and twentythree Communists were wounded and many arrests made, when Communists tried to enter the gates of Paris in protest against the celebration. There was hand-to-hand fighting between demonstrators, and mounted guards, who barred the way of the Commun-ists. The disorder countinued for several hours, during which time there was considerable shooting and the hurling of missiles from the walls o the fortification.
