We have seen a man put his finger under a powerful trip hammer in motion just to show how well he could manage the machine. Many other foolish things are done just to "show off." But most of the accidents happen through a carelessness resulting from familiarity. As long as an operator is afraid of his machine he is not apt to get hurt.
