Marine News

Schr. Lucille M. has gone into winter quarters at Yarmouth.

Dredge W. S. Fielding Capt C. F. Lewis, will lay up at Liverpool for the winter.

Schr. Hattie McKay, Capt Sims, cleared from Parrsboro Thursday with coal for Westport.

Schr. Stewart T. Satter from a New Jersey coal port, sailed from Vineyard, Haven Nov 1st.

The total stock of the Yarmouth schooner Grace & Ruby for the past year, so the Telegram reports was \$76,000.

Yarmouth Light: Schr Dorothy M. Smart, Capt A. Snow, landed 12,000 pounds cod and haddock on Wednesday; the fare was purchased by A. E. Nickerson.

Schr Loran B. Snow was aground in Yarmouth harbor for a while last Wednesday. On that day she landed a fare which stocked \$2,748.60. Considerable gear was lost during the trip which made the share small—\$18 per man.

The tern schr Mapleland, Capt Randall, which was at the railway wharf Bridgewater, the past two weeks loading lumber, has cleared for Cuba. The cargo was shipped by the Davison Lumber & Manufacturing Co., Ltd.

The steamer Prince George arrived at Yarmouth from Boston Friday morning with 193 passengers and sailed to return with 225, which are both record lists for November sailing. Among her outward cargo, were over 600 barrels of fresh mackerel shipped from the traps at Hubbards and other points along the south shore.

Steamer Bernard M., on which carpenters have been engaged rebuilding and enlarging the hatches in the forward deck, cleared Thursday from Yarmouth for Parrsboro to bring soft coal to Yarmouth. Captain Everett R. Nickerson, of Port Clyde, is in command of the Bernard M., and sailed Friday noon for the above port.

A handsome three masted schooner was launched a few days ago from the yard of E. R. Gaudet, Yarmouth. She is a vessel of about 200 tons, gross substantially constructed and finished throughout and will make a most desirable piece of marine property. The vessel is now at a wharf at Yarmouth, where her rigging is being completed, cabins and other work finished.

The steamer which ran into the explosives ship Mont Blanc at Halifax and destroyed part of the city is now known as the Guvernoren. The original name of the Guvernoren was Runic, and for twenty four years she sailed in the White Star line fleet under the British flag. Then she was sold and renamed Tampican and later the Imo. She is now in Barry.

The British schooner Valparaíso, lumber laden, and bound from Bear River (N. S.) for Boston, put into Portland, (Me.) about ten days ago for shelter, and after remaining for several days, started out on Saturday morning with a favorable breeze, but when off Cape Porpoise ran into a strong northeasterly gale during which the flying jib was blown away, and her decks flooded with water, some little damage being done. The captain kept on his course and succeeded in getting into Boston on Sunday.

Yarmouth Telegram: The D. G. steamer Aberdeen Capt Loran Kenney left St. John Thursday and arrived in Yarmouth at noon Friday. Thursday the steamer put down the Pettie Passage bell buoy and then went to Little River, Digby Co., and took off the shore at that place the Meteghan bell buoy which went adrift some Little River. The Aberdeen went to weeks ago and later stranded at Westport and took on board the automatic gas and whistling buoy, but out to mark the Larcher, and which went adrift and was towed into that place.

Once the passenger "Fyer" between Digby and St. John, later, at the outbreak of the war, a scout cruiser in the North Atlantic, off the Canadian and American coasts, then a troop transport across the English Channel, and now a coast training ship in the British navy—that is the record of the steamship "George" since the C. P. R. bought the vessel and brought her out from England three years previous to the war and placed her on the Bay of Fundy route; she succeeded the side wheeler Prince Rupert, another Clyde built "Fyer," in those days, and which was sold to Cuban purchasers. The St. George is now out on another cruise from Plymouth, Las Palmas being her destination. She has a full complement of cadets from the Nautical College at Pangbourne. Captain Cardiff was master of the St. George when she was on this side of the Atlantic, but now Capt J. Hamilton Blair, D. S. C., is in command of the ship.
