- ban the import, manufacture and sale of aerosol products containing controlled CFCs with the exception of certain medical products and essential fire safety products by January 1, 1990.
- ban the import, manufacture and sale of food packaging foam, including food and beverage containers containing or manufactured with controlled CFCs, by January 1, 1990.
 - ban the import, manufacture and sale of portable halon fire extinguishers for home use by January 1, 1990.
- ban the import, manufacture and sale of small pressurized cannisters that contain controlled CFCs including refrigerants, air horns and party streamers by January 1, 1990.

4. FURTHER CONTROL MEASURES

The release within three weeks of a report to begin discussions on the earliest possible prohibition dates for remaining CFC uses. The table below outlines the best available information on dates that alternatives will be available for each use category. As these uses are prohibited appropriate downward adjustments will be made to the total allowable quantities of controlled CFC's consumed in Canada.
