

SURVEY OF THE PROGRESS OF THE FACULTY OF APPLIED SCIENCE  
SINCE 1921 AND OF THE PRESENT REQUIREMENTS.

1. Laboratories and equipment.

Laboratories and Equipment.

(a) Highways Laboratory.
