living in Canada, and I would not be tempted back to England by anything less than the exceptional opportunities of a chair which has always been held by mens of distinction. But in any event I wish to urge upon you that the Faculty has become, so far as administration is concerned, far too much of a one-man affair. It ought to be organised so that any casualty could be replaced at short notice.

I shall be mentioning the matter to Judge Greenshields, but I hope that you will not find it necessary to speak of it to any one else.
