

<b>Death,</b> the state of the dead, or the state of being with- out life	<b>Width,</b> the state of being wide
<b>Growth,</b> the act or state of growing	<b>Wrath,</b> the being in a rage or fury
<b>Earth,</b> the globe on which we live, or (derived from <i>ear</i> , to plow,) the act of turning up the ground in tillage	<b>Worth,</b> the being of value, or a quality of excellence or virtue
<b>Warmth,</b> the being warm or a gen- tle or moderate heat	<b>Aftermath,</b> the second crop of grass mown in autumn
<b>Wealth,</b> the state of having great possessions or riches	<b>Mirth,</b> the state of being merry
<b>Youth,</b> the state and condition of young people, or their persons	<b>Dearth,</b> a state of great scarcity or want of provisions
	<b>Health,</b> the state of being sound of body

**Q.** What does *tude* mean ?

**A.** *Tude* is a termination by which adjectives, and sometimes verbs are converted into substantives, and may be explained by *the state of being*.

#### EXAMPLES.

<b>MULTI-TUDE,</b>	The state of being many or more than one
<b>Ampli-tude,</b> the state of being large or great	<b>Servi-tude,</b> the state of being in bon- dage or slavery
<b>Atti-tude,</b> the posture or action in which a statue or painted figure is placed	<b>Soli-tude,</b> the state of being alone, or a lonely life
<b>Consue-tude,</b> a state acquired by custom or habit	<b>Magni-tude,</b> the state of being great
<b>Simili-tude,</b> the state of being like or a resemblance	<b>Lati-tude,</b> the state of being broad or wide
	<b>Grati-tude,</b> the state of being thankful
