MONDAY forenoon, May 11, will leave his own stable, Hampton, and proceed to John Fice's, Bethesda, noon; own stable night.

TUESDAY afternoon, proceed to Geo. Leask's, lot 33, con. 6, Darlington, night.

WEDNESDAY, proceed to Wesley Glaspel's, Taunton, noon; thence to W. Oke's, Lot 32, Con. 2, Darlington, night.

THURSDAY, proceed to Bennett House, Bowmanville, noon; thence to Bennett's Hotel, Newcastle, night.

FRIDAY, proceed to North American Hotel, Orono, night.

SATURDAY, proceed to his own stable, Hampton, and remain until the following Monday.

The above route will be continued during the season, health and weather permitting.

Will stand for mares, season of 1896, at his own stable, Hampton.
