- In 1901—Of a miniature sack of "No. 1 Hard" Manitoba Wheat.
- In 1902—Of a miniature sack of "Kendrick's Penicillin" made at Fort McPheron, a Hudson's Bay Company post, every three miles across the Arctic Circle and 2,978 miles northwest of Winnipeg, accompanied by an illustrated booklet bound with a deerskin strap.
- In 1903—Of a Gopher-Tail mounted as a good luck-bringer, accompanied by an illustrated booklet containing the Cree legend of the gopher, given in print for the first time.
- In 1904—Of a pen made from a quill of a Canada Wild Goose, with an illustrated booklet containing the Cree legend of the Wild Goose, given in print for the first time.
- In 1905—Of a Flax and Steel, with an illustrated booklet containing the Cree legend of the origin of the car-bolt in print for the first time from a manuscript copied of an officer in the service of the Hudson's Bay Company, dated in the year 1817.
